This projector is light, compact, and completely self-contained. The AP-IC measures 5" x13" x14" and weighs less than 12 pounds. It will take any type of 2 x 2 slide and single frame filmstrips, and may be projected on the built in "Tuck-away" screen, or with the lid removed, on any conventional screen. A 5" accessory lens is available, which converts this machine to a conventional type projector. A translucent plastic screen the same size as the "Tuck-away" screen is also available. Its use allows the audience to be grouped around the far side of the screen while the operator sits beside the projector and faces the group. It may be used this way in a fully lighted room.
